

### Section A

A lawyer asked Jesus what he should do to have eternal life. He did this to test Jesus.

Jesus asked him a question in return. Because the man was a lawyer, Jesus asked him what the Law said.

The lawyer said, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your strength, with all your mind. You shall also love your neighbor as yourself.”

### Section B

“A priest of God’s people came down the road. He did not stop when he saw the injured man. Instead, he passed by on the other side of the road.

“After that, a Levite came. He did not stop when he saw the injured man. Instead, he passed by on the other side of the road.” (Luke 10:30–32)

### Section C

Jesus continued, “Then a Samaritan came. When he saw the injured man, he felt sorry for him. He went to him and helped him. He cleaned and bandaged the man’s wounds. He put him on his donkey so that he would not have to walk. Then he took him to an inn.

“When they arrived, the Samaritan gave the innkeeper some money. He asked the innkeeper to take care of the man who was hurt. He promised to pay for the medicine, food, and anything else that was needed.” (Luke 10:33–35)

### Section D

Then Jesus asked the lawyer, “Who was a neighbor to the injured man?”

The lawyer said, “The one who helped him.”

Jesus said, “Now you go and be a good neighbor to others too.” (Luke 10:36–37)
